Summer reflections for 2026

For the past few years we have filled the pages of our newsletters with reflections from various sources, which we can consider prayerfully over the summer months. We begin with some words from Archbishop Richard Moth, our new Archbishop of Westminster, prior to and at his installation Mass earlier in the year: "God calls us to go out into the world of our own age, carrying with us the message of the Gospel of peace into the public square, where the great questions of our time call for its light to be shone upon them. This is what the Church has always been about. That never changes. What changes is the circumstance. The circumstance of this year is very different from that of 10 years ago even two. Let us ensure that the light of the Gospel shines brightly in our parish communities, in our homes and our schools. At every opportunity, let us shed the light of the Gospel on the world of our day, in our universities, our places of work. God's call is not a call to power as so often exercised in this world to achieve domination over others. Rather it is characterised by self-control, not a self-control 'generated' as it were from within ourselves, but a self-control guided, empowered by the Holy Spirit. How do we bring light into these situations? Not just to shine on it from a distance, but a light that transforms, so that people can start to see another way of looking at this, a way informed by the gospel. The work of evangelisation is vital, but it is fragile and adversely impacted by our failures in love, power and self-control. Here I am most aware of every occasion on which members of the Church, or the Church as a whole, have failed, most especially when the vulnerable have been abused. Such failure calls for listening to and learning from those who have suffered so grievously and a continuing commitment to ensuring that our communities are places where all are safe in their encounter with Christ and with each other."

Pope Leo in Spain

On June 6, Pope Leo began his apostolic journey to Spain by saying that he had come 'to affirm, encourage and instil a renewed fidelity to the gospel among believers and a deeper reconciliation and collaboration across the country.' When leading the Corpus Christi procession with 1.2 million people through the streets of Madrid, he said, "The Christ who processes through the streets in the monstrosity is the same one who identifies with the poor, the downtrodden, those who are alone and forsaken. Herein lies the task of Spain today and in the future: to ensure that religiosity which has shaped and defined this country for centuries is not a museum of the past, but a school of faith...that teaches us to kneel before God and before our neighbour, as no one can kneel before the Lord and despise their brother." In his address to the Spanish parliament he said, "every truly just society is built upon the inviolable dignity of the human person. The defence of human life is neither a partisan issue nor a confessional interest; it is a goal of civilisation...The tragic drama of migration also challenges the conscience of nations and the ethical foundation of the international order today. The world is undergoing a profound and cultural crisis, which manifests in multiple forms of violence, polarisation and mutual distrust".
