Outreach – is an essential part of our mission as Christians. In serving Our Lord, we look not only to the quality of our own lives but also to the lives of others all round the world with whom we share what we have not as a matter of charity but of justice. It is not right for us to have so much when others have so little or nothing and they are our brothers and sisters. Much of this work is carried out through regular fund-raising activities of one sort or another, in addition to mandatory diocesan second collections, CAFOD Fast Days and several 'one-off' needs as they crop up during the year, such as the Venezuelan earthquake and the appalling tragedy in Nepal. We support these needs and crises not only in our prayers but also in this financial manner. So here are some of the regular projects and needs which we support every year:

Developing World Group – this group was set up 40 years ago in response to the Ethiopian famine of 1984, and since that time has raised in excess of £200,000 for various projects many of which have a direct personal connection with our parishes. During the year a number of events take place such as Valentine's Day stall, Mothering Sunday, Easter chicks, Plant sale, autumn produce sale and Christmas Tombola and quiz to raise funds and awareness the results of which are published annually in our report. If anyone would like to offer their services to join our humble group, you will be welcome. Please see Paul and Angela Scola or Norma Armon.

Hope House Orphanage – for the past 20 years we have been supporting this orphanage in Owerri Nigeria, in response to a request from Fr.Michael, who is personally involved in its running. The aim was to 'sponsor' an individual named child's education up to secondary school or beyond and so far 200 children have been supported in this way by our parishes. The organization is a registered charity and funds are sent to it via Fr.Joel Nwalozie in Narborough. The children also need food as many of them do not have sufficient to live on. African Village Dream – this project in the village of Ker Leven in the Gambia was set up by Lee and Pam Glasgow in memory of Stuart to help villagers improve their lives and avoid poverty by introducing the growing of rice in the village. In addition, they have provided the resources to build 7 classrooms for a school. Missio Red Boxes – are used in our homes to support to missionary activity of the church and are collected by David Mather and friends on a regular basis.

Lawrence House – is the hostel for homeless young people round the corner from our church and is supported in many ways and projects during the year

LOROS Hospice – provides sensitive palliative care for people nearing the end of their lives in a beautiful facility in Leicester, which is now struggling for funds as government subsidies have been cut.
